Jennifer spoke with us about why this exclusive journey promises profound insights into Cassatt's life, her pioneering depictions of women's intimate lives, and her role as a cultural ambassador for Impressionism in the U.S.

You mention Mary Cassatt in your new book, The Club: Where American Women Artists Found Refuge in Belle Époque Paris. What makes her such a fascinating figure to explore through this journey?

Jennifer Dasal: Mary Cassatt was an absolute powerhouse—a wealthy Pennsylvania-born woman who defied 19th-century expectations. She pursued a professional painting career in Paris when women couldn't even attend art school. What makes her story so delicious is the sheer audacity of it all! Barred from the École des Beaux-Arts? She copied the Old Masters in the Louvre instead. Frustrated with the stuffy Salon system? She became the only American invited into the French Impressionist circle, where she befriended artists like **Degas, Monet**, and **Pissarro**.

The 2026 centennial of her death offers the perfect opportunity to honor her life in Paris. Experts will lead us on tours of the spaces she frequented, including **Montmartre**, the famous hilltop artists' neighborhood where she lived and

She previously served as Curator of Modern and Contemporary Art at the North Carolina Museum of Art for 13 years. She earned a B.A. from the University of California, Davis, and an M.A. from the University of Notre Dame, both in art history. She also completed Ph.D. coursework in art history at Pennsylvania State University.

worked. We'll gain rare insights into her influences. On a curator-led tour of the **Musée des Arts Décoratifs**, we'll see how Japanese prints and other East Asian traditions inspired some of her important works.

What special access will travelers experience on this journey?

Jennifer Dasal: The exclusive access will be exciting, including an after-hours tour of the Musée Marmottan Monet. An incredible highlight: Outside Paris in Le Mesnil-Théribus, we'll share exclusive tours of Cassatt's two private country estates, both closed to the public, accompanied by a Cassatt historian and the president of the Friends of the Mary Cassatt Association. We'll also share a "full circle" moment: We'll meet a member of the Académie des Beaux-Arts, which once rejected her visionary works, for an inside look at their exhibition space.



FRIDAY, MAY 8: DEPARTUREDepart on an overnight flight to Paris.

SATURDAY, MAY 9: PARIS, FRANCE

Arrive in Paris this morning and transfer to the **Hôtel Montalembert**. After checking in, take a relaxed stroll past Parisian landmarks along the Champs-Élysées and cross the Seine to pass **Cassatt's final Paris residence** at 10 avenue Marignan. Enjoy time at leisure before gathering for a welcome reception.

SUNDAY, MAY 10: PARIS

Walk in Cassatt's footsteps through **Montmartre**, the historic bohemian enclave perched above Paris. In the 1870s, her parents settled along its winding streets while she established a nearby studio. Discover how she formed friendships with fellow Impressionists, including Edgar Degas, Camille Pissarro, and Berthe Morisot.

Take the Montmartre Funicular from the base to the summit of the **Butte Montmartre**, home to the Basilica of the Sacred Heart and the historic Place du Tertre. Walk through the district on a guided tour, passing the former residences of Cassatt, Degas, and other noted artists.

Following lunch, step inside a **local artist's studio** for an exclusive look at his workspace, his craft, and insights from more than 35 years of painting.

Enjoy an expert-led visit to the **Musée de Montmartre**, housed in a 17th-century residence where Renoir, Suzanne Valadon, and Maurice Utrillo lived and worked. View a collection of paintings, posters, and drawings, including pieces by Toulouse-Lautrec and Modigliani. Wander through the **Jardins Renoir**, where the artist found inspiration for works such as *La Balançoire*.

Conclude the day with a private guided visit to **Vignes du Clos Montmartre**, one of the last remaining vineyards in central Paris. Created by the city in 1933, this historic vineyard preserves the area's winemaking traditions dating back to the fourth century A.D. Enjoy a private tasting before heading to a local bistro for a group dinner. B,L,I

MONDAY, MAY 11: PARIS / LE MESNIL-THÉRIBUS / SAINT-PAUL

Spend the morning on a special excursion to **Le Mesnil-Théribus** with Marijke Chaneaud of the Friends of Mary Cassatt Association and historian Michel Chacon. Gain exclusive access to Cassatt's two private estates, both closed to the public.



Begin at the tranquil, early 19th-century **Château de Bachivillers** in the Oise countryside, where Cassatt settled in 1891 to escape the bustle of Paris. In a converted woodshed, she built a studio where she painted, including her mural *Modern Woman* for the Chicago World's Fair.

Continue to the 18th-century **Château de Beaufresne**, her summer retreat for decades, which she purchased in 1894 and equipped with electricity and running water, luxuries at the time. Visit the nearby **Cimetière Saint-Louis**, where Cassatt rests alongside her family—a poignant reminder of her deep ties to France despite her American birth.

After lunch, enjoy an exclusive look at the **Jardin du Peintre André Van Beek**, a prominent contemporary artist who paints in the Impressionist tradition. His landscapes feature floral arrangements and shrubs surrounding seven interconnected pools, crossed by a Picardy bridge and Japanese-style stepping stones. Return to Paris for dinner at leisure.

TUESDAY, MAY 12: PARIS

During an exclusive guided exploration of the **Musée d'Orsay**, housed in a former railway station, experience one of the world's greatest Impressionist and Post-Impressionist art collections. A highlight amid works by Manet, Degas, Courbet, and Renoir is Mary Cassatt's Young Girl in the Garden (Woman Sewing)—a recognition of the American artist's crucial role in the Impressionist movement.





Enjoy lunch aboard a *péniche* on the Seine, taking in gorgeous Parisian views. Afterwards, meet with an Académie des Beaux-Arts member for a private tour of the **Pavillon Comtesse de Caen**. While today it displays the Académie's prize-winning photography, drawings, and architectural works, this institution once represented the conservative art establishment that Cassatt fought against. The evening is at leisure.

WEDNESDAY, MAY 13: PARIS / GIVERNY

Journey to **Giverny** to visit the **Fondation Monet**—the house where the Impressionist genius (and friend of Cassatt) lived for over 40 years. Walk the pathways that sparked his famous *Nymphéas* series, pausing to appreciate flowerbeds, weeping willows, and the Japanese-inspired bamboo groves that fascinated him.

After lunch at the museum restaurant, explore the history and evolution of Impressionism during a guided tour of the **Musée des Impressionnismes**. View works by Monet, Cassatt, Manet, Degas, and Renoir, as well as pieces by artists influenced by Monet, including Alfred Sisley, Maurice Denis, and Hiramatsu Reiji. Conclude with a walk through the museum's peaceful gardens.





Enjoy an exclusive after-hours visit to the **Musée Marmottan Monet** to appreciate the world's largest collection of Monet's works without crowds. Study Impression, Sunrise—the painting that named an entire movement—along with The Japanese Bridge and The House Seen from the Rose Garden, both inspired by his Giverny gardens.

Discover paintings by Berthe Morisot, Cassatt's close confidante and artistic ally. These two women alone broke into the Impressionist exhibitions of the 1870s, forging a bond as they conquered the male-dominated Parisian art scene together. End the evening with a private dinner at a local restaurant.

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THURSDAY, MAY 14: PARIS

Begin the day at the **Petit Palais**, originally built for the 1900 Universal Exhibition before becoming a museum two years later. Admire its decorative murals and sculptures, along with works by Rembrandt, Rubens, Fragonard, Monet, Cézanne, and Delacroix.

Next, take a guided tour of the **Musée de l'Orangerie** and stand before Monet's *Water Lilies*. Considered one of the great monumental achievements of the early 20th century, this masterpiece spans the museum's curved walls in two oval rooms. Explore the Walter-Guillaume collection, featuring 144 paintings by artists such as Cézanne, Matisse, and Modigliani.

Following lunch and free time, meet your guide to explore the **Jardin des Tuileries**. First created in 1564 by Catherine de' Medici, these gardens gained their signature French design when André Le Nôtre, King Louis XIV's landscape architect, redesigned them a century later. Young Cassatt frequently left her copying sessions at the Louvre to find fresh inspiration beneath the garden's leafy alleys.

Stroll through the **Musée des Arts Décoratifs**, home to the world's largest fashion and textile exhibition space, showcasing haute couture designs by Yves Saint Laurent and Christian Dior. Follow the influence of Asian arts on European artists, including Mary Cassatt, during a guided tour focused on Orientalism and Japanese art.

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This evening, gather for a festive farewell dinner.

FRIDAY, MAY 15: PARIS / RETURN

Depart the hotel early this morning for the flight home.
